A Word From Fr. Kris

Knowing only too well the weaknesses and waywardness of human nature, God sent the Holy Spirit to remain with his Church as its infallible guide until the last person has entered heaven. 


Our Parish is hosting a 'Meet & Greet' on May 20th & 21st
